

Day of Service



### FROM PASTOR DIEHL ...

"I will both lie down and sleep in peace; for you alone, O Lord, make me lie down in safety." (Psalm 4:8)

Dear friends in Christ,

I stated in last month's newsletter that the days of summer were beginning to slip away. Well, here we are, and the summer days seem to be all but gone now that vacations are over, and school has resumed for another year. Nevertheless, as you read this, I hope that you have enjoyed your summer and are ready to embrace the next season. Remember ... it's always a good day to have a good day!

As I shared with you last month, for many Christians, beginning a good daytime habit, such as daily prayer, may be hard to do or even seem impossible. Oftentimes many folks don't even know where to begin. As Christians, we know the Lord's Prayer. It's always a great prayer at any time and any place. However, we may not know other prayers and might feel intimidated in any attempt to "make up" our own prayer.

Last month I shared with you how praying Martin Luther's Morning Prayer is a great way to begin the day. Well, guess what? Luther also wrote an Evening Prayer that is an equally meaningful way to end each day. Luther's Evening Prayer is the following:

I give thanks to you, heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ your dear Son, that you have graciously protected me today. I ask you to forgive me all my sins, where I have done wrong, and graciously to protect me tonight. Into your hands I commend myself: my body, my soul, and all that is mine. Let your holy angel be with me, so that the wicked foe may have no power over me. Amen.

This is followed by Luther's comment: "Then you are to go to sleep quickly and cheerfully."

We never know what events of any given day are going to come our way after we awake. However, when we go to bed at the end of our day, we have the opportunity to think back on our day and know exactly how our day went. It could have been a good day or a bad day. We will have undoubtedly sinned against God, committed errors against others, or maybe experienced an unexpected (and unwanted) turn of events in our lives.

So, what do we do when we go to bed at night with a bad day in our rearview mirror? Do we lie in bed fretting over what we did or didn't do? Do we lay in bed staring up at the ceiling and watch the ceiling fan go round and round thinking, "If only I had said/done that a little bit differently?" Do we sometimes find it difficult to fall asleep? Are we thinking about what may come the next day?

Notice what Luther's Evening Prayer says ... "Into your hands I commend myself: my body, my soul, and all that is mine." As we prepare to close our eyes and rest for the night, we are resting in the loving and abiding presence of our Savior Jesus Christ who always orders our days and deeds in peace. We are giving our all to Jesus.

We are basically saying to Jesus in this prayer: "Forgive me of my sins, turn the troubles of this life from distresses into blessings, and allow me to receive a rest that you and only you can give." There is really no better way to rest at night than to do so knowing that we are always resting in the arms of our forgiving and loving Savior.

Friends, as I said last month, beginning a habit of daily prayer does not need to be a daunting task. We can begin with simple steps like praying Luther's Morning and/or Evening Prayer. Why not try it out for a week? Pray Luther's Prayer (Morning or Evening . . . or both!) every day, for one week. We can be assured, there is no better way to begin and end our days!

I look forward to greeting you in worship next Sunday.



### CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS



The Congregation Council met Monday evening, August 19, with the following members, staff, and guests present: Pastor Diehl, Heather Diehl (Secretary), C.J. Frye, Pat Holleman, Bill Holtzman, John Minnick, Steve Povlish, Phyllis Richards, Randy Richards, Jessica Rinker (MCELC Co-Director), Laura Ryman, and Russ Shank (Crutchfield Project Manager). Roger Rudy was unable to attend.

- The Early Learning Center report cited an enrollment of 59 children supported by 16 staff members. The tuition of 20 of the enrolled children is supported by the subsidy program. The Center has a waiting list for most age levels. Painting of the infant room has been completed.
- It was announced that the date and location for the Annual Outdoor Service and Picnic has changed. The worship and picnic will be held on Sunday, September 22, in the pavilion on the grounds of Shenandoah Caverns.
- A report from the Worship and Music Committee noted the annual bell polishing and Singer/Ringer Lunch held Saturday, August 10. The regular Sunday worship time (10:30) will resume September 1. Children's Church will resume September 8. The committee agreed to the use of the "themed liturgy" (versus the ELW liturgy) for all Sunday services.
- Pastor noted that a Constitution Committee had been re-convened to complete the updating of Mount Calvary's constitution and bylaws. One work session has been held. Another is planned.
- Reporting for the Golf Committee, Randy Richards provided a summary of tournament information: 100 golfers in 50 teams, over 120 sponsors and supporters, and \$27,427.50 raised for the General Fund. Randy emphasized the importance of an early start in contacting potential sponsors for the 2025 tournament (July 12-13) as well as increased involvement of church members in promoting and supporting the tournament.
- Russ Shank, Crutchfield Project Manager, presented the company's bid for replacement of the sanctuary sound system and responded to questions from Council members. The Council unanimously agreed to accept Crutchfield's proposal at a cost of \$5,018.95. Church family who wish to contribute to this purchase are encouraged to make their donation to the Building Fund.
- Members continued sharing and discussing information received from June's Small Group Gatherings. A meeting with Pastor John Wertz, Assistant to the Virginia Bishop, is to be scheduled to support on-going discussions regarding the future of Mount Calvary ministries.



### Our Monthly Outreach Offering

July's Outreach Offering generated \$1,450 for the Early Learning Center. The August offering will benefit the Shenandoah County Animal Shelter. At the end of September, our Outreach Offering will be donated to Shenandoah County Public Schools' Weekday Religious Education Program.

Each Sunday, as you are able, the church family is invited to drop loose change, cash, or checks (payable to Mount Calvary Lutheran Church) into the little church donation box located in the narthex.

Thank you for supporting this extension of our ministry to various agencies and service organizations within the area.


